Welcome to GemArts' Spring/Summer 2014 Season

Another year has now started and with it GemArts welcome some brand new faces to the team. After a brilliant 2013 we are really excited to expand the team, and look forward to bringing you another fantastic programme of music, dance and performance from across the UK and Asia.

We begin the Spring/Summer season a little earlier than usual, in February, with Harjinderpal Singh Matharu performing mesmerising ragas in Sage Gateshead. Accompanied by Bhupinder Singh Chaggar on tabla, the evening will showcase the work of these great musicians. In the same month we extend a very warm welcome to Community, who bring their hugely popular Manchester club night to Newcastle's Star and Shadow for one night only. To round off a busy month GemArts are heading down south with partners Akademi and Kala Sangam to present a triple bill of contemporary South Asian dance at London's Southbank Centre. We are delighted to be working on this national initiative supporting two new commissions by emerging choreographers Urja Desai Thakore and Divya Kasturi, winners of our Choreogata Artists Development Programme.

Sage Gateshead plays host to iconic musicians Kushal Das and Kumar Bose when they join us in March. Kushal Das is now considered to be one of the main torchbearers of the sitar, leading a new generation with his mesmerising performances, and we are expecting a night of deeply moving music from these world renowned musicians.

Back for another year in April, is our ever popular Vaisakhi festival. Come and join us for an evening of music, food and great family fun, all for the bargain price of £5 per group! April also sees GemArts continue the partnership with Durham University when we present incredible vocalist Manjiri Asanare-Kelkar in Durham Town Hall.

When summer finally arrives Grammy nominated Debashish Bhattacharya makes a welcome return to the Sage Gateshead. With his own unique take on Indian classical music and an international career spanning more than thirty years, this will be a night to remember. We end the season in June with outstanding vocalist Uday Bhalwalkar as he performs Dhrupad one of the oldest forms of North Indian classical music.

Alongside a full season of performances, GemArts will also be running a busy schedule of workshops and participatory events across the north east.





Experience a triple bill of contemporary South Asian dance at the Southbank Centre this spring. Pioneering South Asian dance organisation Akademi, alongside GemArts and Kala Sangam, presents Seeta Patel's First Light, plus two new contemporary commissions created by the recipients of the Choreogata Artist Development Programme – Divya Kasturi and Urja Desai Thakore.

First Light is in an interplay between dance, music, light and space choreographed by Bharatanatyam dancer Seeta Patel and composed by John Metcalfe. This piece combines the aesthetics of contemporary and Bharatanatyam dance and takes inspiration from the age-old concepts of good overcoming evil, light overcoming darkness, and the divine female energy of the Hindu Goddess Durga.

Alongside First Light, the Choreogata recipients present two new pieces of work. FYP – Forgot Your Password by Divya Kasturi, exploring technology and virtual identity and Detox by Urja Desai Thakore who creates complex contemporary movements from classical Indian styles.



As a lap steel aficionado, as well as an innovative performer, Debashish Bhattacharya has been operating 'beyond the ragasphere' for decades. His unique take on Indian classical music has cemented an international career for over thirty years, modernising classical melodies and rhythms with multiple levels of percussion and lightning-fast group unison solos. Born in the pulsing city of Kolkata (Calcutta), Debashish was thrust into a musical world from an early age, practicing with his talented family and experimenting on his first Hawaiian steel guitar at the age of three.
