Our classical concerts offer incredible opportunities to see the finest musicians from India and the UK live in the north east, beginning with bansuri master Rakesh Chaurasia, and continuing with three eminent musicians, Pandit Bharat Bhushan Goswami, Ustad Dharambir Singh and Pandit Ramdas Palsule.




